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THE LEFT HAS JUST UNITED CAN IT LAST?

America's two major leftist parties, who were already cooperating closely have just taken that cooperation to its logical conclusion.

In response to last week's no confidence vote against the government, The Socialist Party Of America and the Social Democrat Party have begun the process of merging their respective parties together.

This is the first time in American history that two parties have willingly merged with each other.

Not all of the Social Democrat Party is happy with this merger; several members affiliated with the party's centrist faction reportedly left the conference early.
